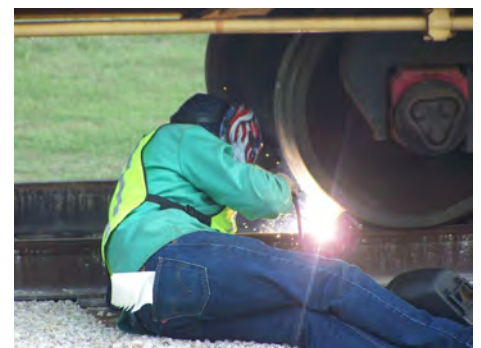

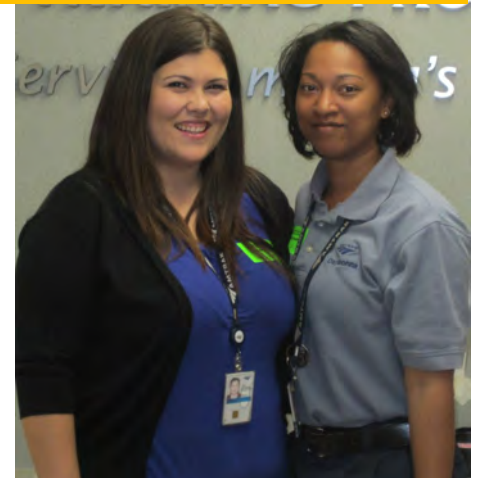
What a Story—Made for the Movies! Two Brothers' Odyssey to Success in America!

"I originally attended **Kittrell Job Corps** in Kittrell, NC. I trained in the Facility Maintenance, Cable Networking, and Electricians I trade. I heard about TCU/IAM through the Career Transition Representative. I was president of the SGA and did well in my trades and was recommended and accepted for Advanced Training at the Potomac Job Corps Center. I was originally interested in working in the Airline industry so I figured I'd give it a shot. I moved to Washington, D.C. and started the TCU/IAM program. I completed the TCU/IAM curriculum pretty quickly in only about four months. I made it down to the last three people being interviewed out of a 100 group interview, but just came shy of making it. I then applied for Amtrak Auto Train On Board Service in Lorton, VA and was hired! I started working there in February 2009. I am currently working On Board Service where I fill many position such as Chef, Service Attendant, Dining Attendant, Bartender and Coach Attendant. This is the best position to be in because I have been trained in everything and can move to any position. I travel to and from Florida on a daily basis and take advantage of free train tickets for as many vacations as possible! I am very appreciative of the TCU/IAM Advanced Training Program.
