"The IAM is a union that brings pride to American workers," said TCU International President Robert Scardelletti at the IAM Convention in Orlando, FL.

Scardelletti addressed the Convention delegates, describing TCU's membership, its goals, and the steps that brought TCU to its affiliation toward merger with the Machinists. Here are excerpts from that speech:

"Like many unions, including the IAM, we were founded in the railroad indusment. We played a major role building this country."

Proud Past

"TCU is a strong, effective union with a proud past. We represent clerks, carmen, yardmasters and supervisors on every major railroad across this nation. We also have members under the National Labor Relations Act. A perfect example is right here in Disney World where we have 2,000 members.

"We reached the point where our membership was trending downward. We realized that as our membership dropped below 50,000, the ability to maintain the type of representation we believed our members deserve from their union could be in jeopardy.

"Our delegates had the foresight to recognize this at our 2004 Convention. I was charged with the responsibility of seeking out and finding a union that would meet our objectives.

"The long relationship with the IAM was instrumental at the very beginning of our talks, as there was a preexisting respect for each other. We chose the Fighting Machinists because you are a union that brings pride to American workers.

"You fight like TCU fights, every day, day in, day out. Now, TCU, together with the IAM, is the largest rail union in the U.S. And I foresee using that combined strength to achieve even better contracts in the future. With the IAM, TCU's future is bolder than ever before." "Of course, how well we do in the immediate future will be greatly influenced by who will be elected this November as the next President of the United States.

"We also endorsed Hillary Clinton in the Democratic primary. What a difference between eight years of President Clinton and eight years of President Bush who literally hates unions and everything we stand for. He and his corporate cronies would have us working in servitude.

"I know how tough your job is every day, on the frontline, at the work site. I was there. I walked in your shoes. I started out as a yard clerk in Cleveland, OH, with the New York Central Railroad in 1967. Four years later I was elected Local Chairman and from that point forward I have devoted my entire life to the union.

"The union is the last line of defense for the American worker. Brothers and sisters, I salute you."
