

This letter will serve to announce the dates of the IAM Human Rights Classes for 2007 scheduled at the William W. Winpisinger Education and Technology Center in Southern Maryland.

The purpose of the Class is two fold. For IAM District and Local Lodges that are without a Human Rights Committee, the Class will provide practical information and guidance on establishing an active Human Rights Committee. For those lodges with established Committees, the focus will be on strategies that will assist them in becoming a proactive and constructive force in protecting our members' rights. In addition to discussing the duties and responsibilities of Human Rights Committees, participants will have the opportunity to meet with activists from other lodges across the United States and Canada to exchange ideas, information, strategies, and experiences.

The Human Rights Class will cover, among other topics:

- > Strategic Action Planning for Human Rights Committees.
- > Workplace Intervention Strategies and Skills.
- > Human Rights Committees: Avenues for Action Organizing and Political Action.
