RESOLUTION ON THE SUSPENSION OF EUROPEAN UNION TRADE PREFERENCES TO BELARUS

The ITUC General Council, meeting at its $2^{\rm rd}$ Session in Brussels on $20\text{-}22~{\rm June}~2007$

CONDEMNING the persistent repression of basic trade union rights by the

government of Belarus over a period of many years;

NOTING that trade benefits to Belarus under the European Union (EU)

Generalised System of Preferences have as from 21 June been

suspended by the EU;

EMPHASISING that sole responsibility for that decision resides with the

government of Belarus, due to its failure to implement the recommendations of an ILO special Commission of Enquiry concerning violations of freedom of association and the right to

collective bargaining;

WELCOMES this expression of the EU's commitment to supporting respect for

core labour standards;

EXPRESSES its fullest solidarity support to the BKDP and all independent

trade unionists in Belarus;

NOTES that the ILO Governing Body, at its November 2007 session, may

give consideration to any steps taken by the government of Belarus to implement the recommendations of the Commission of

Enquiry; and,

CALLS UPON the government of Belarus to implement in full and without delay

the recommendations of the Commission of Enquiry, as a basis for

ensuring full respect for fundamental workers' rights.
