

McCain Against Aviation Labor Rights

- Led the fight to impose "baseball style arbitration" on bargaining disputes to help management and hurt workers [S. 1327, 8/2/2001]
- Blocked FedEx workers from forming a union [H.R. 3539, Vote #304, 10/3/96]
- Fought to gut pilots' pension rights [S. Amdt. 3159 to H.R. 11, Vote #231, 9/23/92]
- Supported Bush's declaration that union rights for airport screeners are a terrorism risk [S. Amdt. to S.4, Vote \$4.3/7/07, American Property of Security on the Chap ? 3/1/07]

McCain Against Aviation Labor Rights

 Backed Eastern Airlines' bankruptcy plan, which avoided labor negotiations and destroyed 43,000 jobs
 [H.R. 1231, Vote #276, 10/26/89; H.R. 1231, Vote #273, 10/26/89; H.R. 1231, Vote #222, 10/3/89]

- Opposes bargaining rights for U.S. flight crews flying abroad [ALPA Presidential Survey, Air Line Pilot, February 2000]
- Would not support bargaining rights for FAA workers [Refused to cosponsor S. 2201, 2006]

McCain Against Collective Bargaining

• Voted against the Employee Free Choice Act card check legislation [H.R. 800, Vote #227, 6/26/07]

 Backs companies that fire or replace lawfully striking workers [ALPA Presidential Survey, Air Line Pilot, February 2000; S. 55, Vote #121, 6/16/92]

McCain Against Collective Bargaining

 Opposed bargaining rights for firefighters, police officers, and other public safety workers

McCain Against Aviation Workers

Votes Against Aviation Security

- Supported \$752 million in cuts to aviation security programs [S. Amdt. 3034 to S.Con.Res. 83, Vote #59, 3/16/06]
- Voted against safety and security standards for U.S. aircraft repairs in third world countries [S. Amdt. 914 to S. 824, Vote #224, 6/12/03]

McCain Against Aviation Security

Even after 9/11, McCain...

- Fought funding for air marshals, TSA security, and TSA explosion detection
 Systems [Press Release S.2537, "Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Bill for Fiscal Year 2005: Objectionable Provisions," 9/15/04]
- Voted to gut flight attendant anti-terrorism training requirements [H.R. 2115, Vote #453, 11/17/03]

Post 9/11 Relief for Laid-Off Aviation Workers

- Bush Administration called a bill providing unemployment benefits for laid-off airline workers "excessive" [Crawley, John, "Bush Opposes GOP-Led Plans for Airline Aid," Reuters, 4/3/03]
- McCain agrees: voted against jobless benefits for laid off airline workers [S. Amt. 1855 to S.1447, Vote

#293, 10/11/01]

Advocates Air Traffic Control Privatization

- Fierce advocate for privatizing the air traffic control system repeatedly votes for privatization [H.R. 2115, Vote #453, 11/17/03; S. Amdt. 893 to S. 824, Vote #222, 6/12/03]
- Personally introduced legislation to privatize air traffic control system [S. 1239, 9/13/95]
- Believes contract towers are "safer" than FAAstaffed air traffic control towers ["DOT IG Finds Contract Towers Safe As Privatization Fight Escalates. Aviation Weekly. Volume 77; Issue 10, 9/8/03]

McCain Backs Foreign Takeover of U.S. Aviation

- In 2006, McCain pushed George Bush's agenda to allow foreign interests to takeover U.S. airlines [S. Amdt. 3619 to H.R. 4939, 4/26/06]
- Bragged about his legislation to double foreign investment in U.S. airlines

 Wants to allow foreign airlines to fly between U.S. cities, saying "I believe that the U.S. policy on cabotage should be relaxed."

• Voted to allow foreign cargo carriers to operate in U.S. [H.R. 2115, Vote #453, 11/17/03]

McCain Fights to Offshore American Jobs

- In 2008, the Defense Department awarded a \$35 billion contract to EADS-Airbus, a foreign airplane builder
- This contract will abolish 44,000 American jobs [Matthew Daly "Boeing Supporters Target McCain over Tanker Loss," Associated Press, 3/8/08]
- Deal called unfair by GAO, an independent auditor

McCain Fights to Offshore American Jobs

- 2003: Helped foreign manufacturers bid on military contracts [S. Amdt. 783 to S. 1050, Vote #191, 5/21/03]
- 2006: McCain wrote letters to Department of Defense urging them to OK the EADS-Airbus tanker deal [Herszenhorn, David M., "McCain Advisers Lobbied for Europeans to Win Air force Tanker Deal The New York Times, 03/12/08]
- 2008: Five high-level McCain campaign staffers are former lobbyists for EADS-Airbus
