'The Game' is On

In conjunction with a campaign on Facebook, the ad calls for concrete changes to restore the balance that a just economy requires. "It's time to make these tax dodging crooks pay their fair share on all their income and corporate profits, " says the ad. "It's time Wall Street paid its taxes to fund a real American Jobs recovery."
