I write to strongly urge you to reject an amendment proposed by Senator McCain to the Keystone XL Pipeline bill, S. 1, which would end the U.S. ship building requirement of the Jones Act. While the IAM has not taken a position on the Keystone XL Pipeline legislation, we are deeply concerned about Senator McCain's totally unrelated and short sighted amendment.

The Jones Act performs a critical function in maintaining the shipbuilding capabilities of our nation's defense industrial base. Consequently, the Jones Act has the strong support of the U.S. Navy and the Department of Defense.
