According to his nomination, Eric Davidson acted courageously and selflessly when he did not hesitate, even in the face of imminent danger, to risk his own life to save another."

The team member was trapped between two pieces of rail and the team was successful in quickly freeing him, calling 911, and notifying the dispatcher to stop train traffic. Due to this quick response the team saved his life.

**President's Award for Leadership—** Anella Popo-Griffith transferred from the **Edison Job Corps Center** to the Atlanta Job Corps TCU Advanced Training program and started with Amtrak's Auto Train in 1995. She held many positions over her career including Station Manager, District Manager of Stations and most recently Route Director for the *City of New Orleans* and the *Crescent*. ## **Christy Miller Returns to Say Thanks**

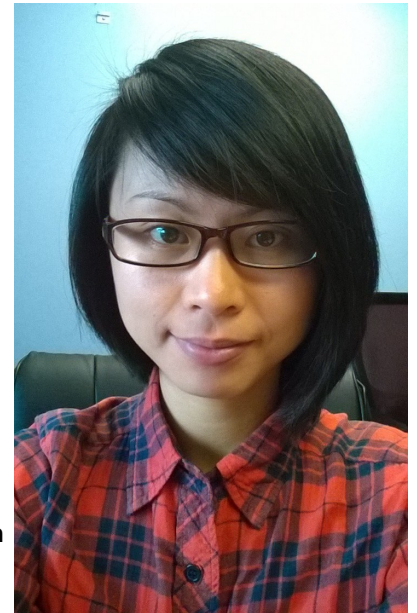

Abdul transferred to Potomac TCU/IAM Advanced Training in January of 2012. Accustomed to working with his hands, he had to make a lot of adjustments to the office setting, strict rules, regulations, and amount of coursework that you must embrace as a TCU/IAM trainee.
