Forming a committee always starts with communication. Communicate with other members and lodge leaders to get their support and feedback.


Once a committee is established, you'll want to: pick a relevant issue, design a plan with sound goals, stick to a realistic timeline, educate members on issues and grow participation.

The IAM's Human Rights Department reaffirms the Union's commitment to providing an environment free of harassment and discrimination for all of our members and their communities.

This is done by providing a comprehensive training program built around the department's Action Plan and outline of the Human Rights Committee ROLE. This Action Plan consists of four functions:

- **R**epresent Be the voice of diversity
- Organize Reach diverse groups
- Legislate Get involved with legislation

The Women's Rights Department offers an annual training program focused on empowering Sisters within the Union, and teaching them key leadership skills.
