Certain States have cut off dates for you to **Register to Vote**. For example, Rhode Island has a cut-off date of October 4<sup>th</sup> to be registered to vote. That is 30 days away from Election Day!! Check your state's rules here:

- Sign Up to Vote by Mail or Absentee Ballot if You Can
- Be a Poll Worker or Recruit One
- If You Have to or Wish to Vote in Person:
  - Vote early if possible

- Know where to go
- Bring your Government issued ID, mask, and black pen
