MEMBERSHIP SOLIDARITY PROVES ITSELF IN GROUNBREAKING UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDED TENTATIVE AGREEMENT

The solidarity of the membership and leadership of local union leaders across all 16 International Paper (IP) Mills was seen through a groundbreaking unanimously recommended Tentative Agreement

This is a 4 year agreement with highlights that include dismantling the 2nd Tier and replacing it with a competitive New Wage System with unprecedented wage increases effective June 1, 2023. The membership will realize general wage increases that total 12.5% over the life of the local agreement. In terms of Healthcare there were no concessions—only gains and much more. The Master Agreement will be printed in CBA Booklet form for every member.

Some of the assistance the department offers are contract, organizing, educational assistance and even global political assistance through IAM's affiliation with Building and Woodworkers International—a global union with 12 million members in 135 countries.
