Dear Representative:

On behalf of the 600,000 active and retired members of the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers (IAM Union), I write today to thank the bipartisan group of 218 House members who signed the discharge petition (H. RES. 432) to force consideration of the Protect America's Workforce Act (H.R. 2550). I now urge <u>all House offices to support the process for successful passage</u> of this important legislation that is aimed at restoring collective bargaining rights of federal workers targeted by President Donald Trump's March 27th Executive Order (EO), which ends collective bargaining with federal unions.

The bill, introduced by U.S. House Reps. Brian Fitzpatrick (R-PA) and Jared Golden (D-ME), would nullify the EO Exclusions from the Federal Labor-Management Relations Programs, which removes collective bargaining rights from 75 percent of the federal workforce.

The IAM is a strong advocate for workers' rights and firmly believes this EO is blatantly illegal. This EO is an assault on the rights and job security for federal workers caring for our veterans, keeping our military ready, adjudicating passport applications, caring for our public lands, and performing countless other essential public services.

The IAM is proud to be a very diverse labor union that represents thousands of federal workers, including those represented by the National Federation of Federal Employees (NFFE-IAM), an affiliate representing approximately 110,000 federal workers across the U.S.

Federal workers matter! These are hard-working individuals who are our neighbors, our relatives and our friends, and they've taken the civic duty to ensure our nation keeps moving forward. Federal workers deserve the right of collective bargaining, which provides protections in the workplace and better service to the public, just to name a few benefits.

Again – the IAM strongly supports this bipartisan measure that aims to restore collective bargaining rights to our nation's federal workforce.
